Welcome

Secretary Corri Wilson called the meeting to order at 9:39am.

Reading & Approval of Minutes

Secretary Corri Wilson presented the September 29 minutes. Tracy Neish made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Seconded by Stephanie Ingram and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

Vice-President Stephanie Ingram presented the most recent financials. Corri Wilson motioned to approve the financials. Seconded by Tracy Neish & passed unanimously.

PTA Updates

- Stephanie Ingram informed everyone that the Middle School would be having their book fair the following week. Scholastic dollars were posted! Primary earned \$763, Elementary earned \$432, & Middle earned \$374.
- Signature chocolate sales ended & \$70,000 in product was sold. Pick-up is 11/11 & 11/12.
- The Jimano's fundraiser is all day & the PTA earns 20% of all sales. The Panera fundraiser is 11/14, 4-8pm.
- Dunkfest sign-ups were doing well with 29 teams (117 kids) registered at that time. The 6th-8th graders had the most sign-ups with many of them from nearby schools.
- The WRSA Trunk-or-Treat was 10/23 & the PTA planned to have a costumed/themed table to hand out treats.
- The spiritwear website was launched & would run through 10/30.
- There were 267 members to date.

Administrative Reports

- Primary
 - Stacey Anderson reported that students are back to having Wildcat Wednesday assemblies with Wiley! The school has now practiced each of the safety drills at least once. The students & staff were all excited for the upcoming Halloween parade.
- Intermediate
 - Timothy Sheldon announced that the parents would be invited back into the building for the Halloween parties! A coffee & donuts drop-in would be starting for parents to get to know staff. Over 300 students were involved in some sort of extracurricular activity.
- Middle
 - Tiffany Drake reported that the Beautification Committee plans to work over the next couple of years to improve the building. She sends out a lot of information to students in Schoology & sends out highlights on each Friday.
- Superintendent
 - There had been a Township Safety Meeting with an hour-long presentation with the SRO of District 56 covering various safety topics. K-3 is looking for Parent Mentors for Reading Literacy. Thank you to all of the wonderful principals at District 50!

Community Update

- Brooke Hagstrom reported that the Annual Food Drive will be set up in December as a store for families to come in & shop, as in years pre-COVID. A new trend to watch out for is swatting-people call in hoax shooter tips.

Open Discussion
